

Shelly Ewald's practice focuses on international and domestic construction contracting and federal government contracts. She has represented contractors and owners on a range of projects including power plants, petrochemical refineries, pipeline construction, mass transit systems, airport projects and historic renovation projects. Shelly has been involved as advice and litigation/arbitration counsel on more than twenty-five domestic and international power plant projects, including nuclear, coal, petroleum coke, natural gas and wind projects. She has represented clients in federal and state courts, recently winning a \$45 Million jury verdict for lost productivity damages against the City of Los Angeles Department of Water and Power and successfully defending the verdict before the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals in 2020. She has served as lead counsel in domestic and international arbitrations, including ICC arbitration and arbitration before the Republic of China Arbitration Association. Shelly is currently the President-elect of the American College of Construction Lawyers and an arbitrator on the AAA Construction panel.
